COUNTY VOTER INFORMATION GUIDES ON THE WAY FOR NOV. 7, 2017 UNIFORM DISTRICT ELECTION

Approximately 32,200 County Voter Information Guides started going out to Imperial County registered voters and approximately 17,600 ballots started to go out Oct. 10, 2017.

Material in the voter information guide will help voters make informed choices. Voters may mark their selections on the voter information guide and use it to help them complete their official ballot at the polls. The Registrar of Voters recommends that voters review the materials before casting an official ballot. If voters do not receive an information guide in the mail, it will be available online at www.co.imperial.ca.us/regvoters. Voters also may call the registrar's office at 442-265-1060 to request a mailed copy.

The Nov. 7, 2017 Uniform District Election is not a countywide election so some areas of the county are not included in the election. Call the registrar's office at 442-265-1060 if you have any questions about your eligibility to vote.

Voter polling-place locations may be found on the Voter Information Guide as an insert.

Below is a list of important deadlines for the Nov. 7 election:

- Oct. 10 – First day of early voting in the Registrar's of Voter's office and first day the registrar is allowed to mail vote-by-mail ballots to voters.
- Oct. 23 – Last day to register to vote for the Nov. 7 election.
- Oct. 31 – Last day to register may accept mailed requests for vote-by-mail ballots. After Oct. 31, voters must go to the registrar's office to request and pick up a vote-by-mail ballot. Voters who have requested but not received a vote-by-mail ballot by Oct. 31 should contact the registrar's office at 442-265-1060.
- Nov 4 and 5 – Weekend voting at the Registrar of Voter's office at 940 W. Main St., El Centro, CA 92243 from 9:00am to 3:00pm.
- Nov. 7 – Election Day

Polling places are open from 7:00am to 8:00pm on Election Day. Vote-by-mail ballots must be received by elections officials no later than the close of the polls on Election Day or be postmarked on or before Election Day and received no later than three days after Election Day to be counted.
